Add our phenomenal guest artists—violinist Tessa Lark, cellist Julian Schwarz, and pianists Michelle Cann, Orion Weiss and Joyce Yang—and we've got what we hope you'll agree is a compelling, can't-miss season.

We're so grateful to each of you for joining us and for continuing to make live music a priority in your lives. From all of us at the Pasadena Symphony, please accept this sincere, hearty welcome to our new season. We hope you'll enjoy these programs as much as we look forward to sharing them with you!
